After the brilliant win in the 1st test, at the time of crisis, Gambir played 643 minutes, faced 436 balls making 137 which was instrumental in saving the Napier Test. A draining knock played suppressing natural style for more than seven hours showing fierce focus is indeed commendable. In the third test marred by weather Indians were on top and lack of result forced upon by bad light and rain altered the lead but not the result of the series. Indians perhaps played a bit too long and whether there could be plans for weather even when advance forecasts were available is a mood point.

If you are fascinated about the money a player can make, please read on this story about a player who rubbed shoulders with the only inductee from kiwiland to ICC Hall of Fame. This hard working, accurate fast medium is named Ewen Chatfield who had an unforgettable Test debut against England at Auckland way back in 1974-75 for all wrong reasons. He represented NZ in 45 tests and in 114 ODIs and took more than 100 wickets in each form. Though overshadowed by the illustrious Sir Richard Hadlee, he nevertheless formed an effective an opening partnership with him for a decade. In 1987-88 against England, Chatfield took 13 wickets at only 15 runs apiece. He was awarded an MBE for his services to cricket. He toured India during 1987 and was infact the final victim of Chetan Sharma's hat-trick and was hit all over for 39 in 4.1 overs in the same match. This story certainly is not about his exploits on the field but the life he lives today and his maverick approach to life.

After long years of cricket at the highest level, he retired in 1989, coached some minor teams, was a lawn mower, did odd jobs and now works 13 hours a day driving a taxi. A great cricketer living as a taxi driver? Can that be thought of in this cricket crazy nation? That is a fact of life at Wellington where he lives. In his playing days he had tresses of unruly hair, long side burns and big moustache.

After some achievements on field, this man is not sad but satisfied man without any complaints. On field he played gently and perhaps lives life the same way. It is truly a story of somebody living an extraordinary life in a normal manner. Cricketers are called gentlemen and men like Chatfield are truly one.

Ans: It is the river referred as Vriddh Ganga / Dakshin Ganga – Godavari – originates in the Western Ghats, flows eastwardly across the Deccan Plateau through the States of Maharashtra and Andhra. Nearer destination, at Rajahmundry the river splits into two streams forming a very fertile delta. On the banks of this river is located Nasik, Triyambak and Bhadrachalam. Some of its tributaries include Indravati River, Pranahita, Manjira, Bindusara and Sabari kinnerasani. The Asia's largest rail-come-road bridge on the river Godavari linking Kovvur and Rajahmundry is considered to be an engineering feat. The length of the new Railway bridge is 2730 meters, has 28 bow string arch girders with equal spans of 97.5 m. The bridge is considered to be fit for 250 kmph services.
