The elections in Tamilnadu for the 234 assembly constituencies are just over and there has been a very high % of voting which augurs well. There were total of 4.59 crores of voters of which 2.31 were male and 2.28 were females. The polling was peaceful and the efforts of Election Commission is really commendable. But the voters, politicians and all others of TN as also their counterparts in neighbouring Kerala will have to wait with bated breathe as counting of votes would happen only on 13th May 2011.

Days prior, 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2011 turned the most cherished day as much as the 25<sup>th</sup> June 1983 as India won the Cricket World Cup 2011 bringing in great joy to all cricket fans. The extravaganza of 14 Nations and 49 matches concluded with a grand win sealed by a strong performance by the captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni. The Nation rejoiced. The IPL 4 is immediately on and there is much to watch... Earlier, we launched Cricket contest for furthering our list of blood donors by riding on the popularity of WC. Thousands have participated in the contest for predicting the winners and soon the winner's list would be announced and fabulous prizes distributed in a grand function.

The cricket had in some ways pushed the beleaguered issues to the backburner - there was serious trouble with series of corruption scandals – of money illegally made on contracts for the Commonwealth games, premier housing projects, allocation of scarce airwaves – politicians looting billions and more. A fresh of whiff of air has been breathed in to the atmosphere by a frail Anna Hazare who led a phenomenal people-powered victory to purge India of corruption. After 90 hours of fasting against corruption, the Govt. issued a gazette notification constituting a 10-member joint committee of ministers and civil society activists, including him, to draft an effective Lokpal Bill. The Jan Lok Pal should indeed be a great precursor of the good things that are to come. Pertinently, the Govt. drafted bill has failed to pass through Rajya Sabha for 42 years. PM has now assured that the Lokpal Bill would be introduced in 2011 monsoon session of Parliament.

The election process in SYMA has all along been smooth as the office bearers see it only as an opportunity to serve the society. Our AGM is slated to be held on 1st of May 2011 whence elections would be held, if necessary. On 28<sup>th</sup> Feb 2011, in the Cricket contest launched by us, the musical instrumental fusion was a programme arranged in short notice and

the instrument played by TGR Anandam caught everybody's eyes. Shri Thanjavur Gopal Ramadoss Anandam is perhaps the only person who plays this instrument on stage. Reportedly it is too tough to play this instrument and requires sustained energy. Mr Anandam is the illustrious son of Thanjavur Ramadoss who was a renowned clarinet artist. The saxophone is well known (to us after Kadri Gopalnath) who reportedly was enthused after seeing it in the Mysore palace band set. It is a conical-bore transposing musical instrument of woodwind family. They are made of brass and played with a single reed mouthpiece similar to clarinet. It reportedly was invented in 1841 by Belgian Adolphe Sax and named after the inventor. It was patented in 1846. The one that we saw on stage was different - it was soprano saxophone a variant. In Western world, it is compared to a type of clarinet. It is louder and has more penetrating sound in extreme high notes. It is stated that Soprano saxophones are usually straight, but sometimes have slightly or fully curved necks and bells. The soprano has all of the keys on other saxophone models.

It is widely used by Jazz and other western music artists and using it as a main instrument and playing Carnatic music should certainly be a challenge. Thanjavur Anandham really enthralled us and delighted all those present at the venue with his mastery. Long live such artists.

#### Gold winner SYMA Cricket WC Contest 2011.

### **Celebrating an Indian Victory – WC 2011**

2<sup>nd</sup> April would be a golden day in the annals of Indian Cricket. The 2011 ICC Cricket WC was the 10<sup>th</sup> WC – initially to be co-hosted by Pakistan but ICC decided to strip them off the hosting rights after the 2009 attack on Lankans at Lahore. 14 Nations, 43 days, 49 matches – all accorded ODI status. India struggled in the initial stage with a tie against England and loss to SA – but defeated Australia, Pakistan and then Lankans by 6 wickets in the finals. The biggest upset was England beaten by Ireland when Kevin O Brien scored the fastest century in WC (off 50 balls – 113 off 63). Ireland also made the highest successful run chase in World Cup. Sad that the next WC would have only 10 Nations. In all other sports, a spot in the WC is a reward and encouragement. Restricting it to recognized Nations seems to be a shortsighted move.

On 2<sup>nd</sup> April (Sat) – it was close 11 pm and perhaps the entire India was awake. There were sounds of crackers, people shouting in happiness as Dhoni received the trophy – the ICC World Cup was lifted – icons were getting lifted – the stadium bustled and spectacular fire works were on. This is the moment of great pride for all Indians and for the cricketers it has already started raining money. BCCI announced 1 crore to each team member, 50 lakhs each to Gary Kirsten and his support staff, the Selectors got 25 lakhs each – but BCCI would still seek tax exemption and the Govt. would waste hours discussing and finding out means to relieve BCCI.

The Lankans have now lost the final hurdle of International tournament thrice – the present WC, the previous WC 2007 finals and the T20 WC in England. Sangakkara said that it was hugely disappointing to miss this once a lifetime opportunity, praised the Indian team and said that perhaps when playing India, a score of 350 + would be required to contain. A polished and seasoned speech and Kumara Sangakkara deserves special praise, one thought but not when one thinks of the start to this match.

When we were expecting R Ashwin, in the place of injured Ashish Nehra, it was Sreesanth who had a poor 5 over spell against Bangla in the opening game. Lankans made sweeping changes – Angelo Mathews, Rangana Herath, Chamara Silva and Ajanta Mendis were out – in came – Perera, Randiv, Kulasekara and Chamara Kapugedera. A classic century by the veteran Mahela Jayawardene, an ordinary bowling performance ended up a decent score of 274.

Immediately after lunch, at around 0650 pm – a hush descended at Wankhede. The slinger Malinga bowled to Virender Sehwag who generally opens with a four off the first delivery. This time not and of the second ball, Sehwag was given out leg before. He went for a review but still was out. First wicket gone without score on board. The first ball of the seventh over silenced the Nation. The noisy Wankhede went in to a huddle. The ball moved got the outside of Sachin and thudded into the gloves of Sanga. At that point 31/2, not many were optimistic of India. A very well phased innings by Gambhir, who unfortunately missed his century and his century partnership with Dhoni enabled Indians pull off a great win.

It was a bizarre start to the Finals even with Ravi Shastri and the match referee Jeff Crowe, an International from Kiwiland – but there had to be retoss. If not others, Sangakkara certainly knew what it really was! the match started with a confusion in the toss – there was a retoss, Sanga won and decided to bat first – the result is now history.

**Answer :** The Act of 1935 abolished dyarchy and ensured provincial autonomy creating a bicameral legislature in Madras. The Legislative Assembly consisted of 215 members. Congress won in Feb 1937 and Chakravarthi C Rajagopalachariar was elected as leader of CLP. Despite being the majority, Congress refused to accept power in all 6 provinces they had won as they objected to special powers given to Governor including, the power to overrule the Cabinet. The Governor of Madras, Lord Erskine, decided to form an interim provisional Government with non-members and opposition members of the Legislative Assembly. V. S. Srinivasa Sastri was first offered the Chief Ministership of the interim government but he refused to accept it. Eventually an interim Government was formed with Kurma Venkata Reddy Naidu of the Justice Party as Chief Minister on 1 April 1937.

On 1 July 1937 the Congress Working Committee (CWC) agreed to form Governments in the provinces they had won. On 14 July 1937 Rajaji was sworn in as the Chief Minister.
