Year after year, we have been enhancing our reach and are trying to make more students benefit from our Educational Aid. Even in a metropolitan city like Chennai, there are children who cannot afford good dress and our distribution of uniform has been handy to good number of students in attending school with dignity. Besides distribution of Uniforms, we have been recognizing school toppers of schools in Triplicane. The financial aid to college students is somewhat recent activity and this year, we honoured the meritorious students of our SYMA Growth as well.

12th July was an important day and the overcast sky did give some anxious moments as this time, the dais was erected on the open auditorium. By the benevolence of God the function went off very well. The function started with Prayer. Our President TA Sampathkumar welcomed the gathering and made the presidential address tracing the origin, focussing our thrust areas and highlighting our success path thus far.

Students need to have role models on whom they can aspire to emulate and this year we had two distinguished guests – Dr V Irai Anbu, IAS and R Nataraj, IPS. The function was compered by S Sampathkumar and after introduction of the Chief Guests, mementoes were given to them by our Vice President - R Seshadri and our Treasurer Sudarshan.

Dr V Irai Anbu has been a distinguished administrator besides being a great literary person. His writings – Random Thoughts, HRM concepts in Thirukkural have evoked great responses. He started off telling that on enquiring about the origin of SYMA, he understood that the name Srinivas is not a person but 'the presence' – a reference to the almighty. He stated that many are deprived of opportunities and likened the deprived children to uncut diamonds which might look like pebbles. He commended the name "Bliss" for the newsletter of SYMA stating that whilst pleasure could be individualistic, bliss which is the ultimate satisfaction would be for the benefit of the society.

We were proud to have an upright Police Officer, winner Presidential Awards whose journey started in Tirunelveli, flowed through Ladakh, Kathmandu, Jammu & Kashmir and North East. It was happy moment to have a great person who had studied in Hindu High School of Triplicane and who had embellished high profile posts including the Commissioner of Police of the City. Mr R Nataraj IPS also has a passion for writing and displays concern for the society in his blogs and portrayed them exceptionally during his tenure as in charge of the Prisons. Thiru R Nataraj in his reverberating speech emphasized the foundation laid

by the mother in the formation of the growth of the child and quoted statistics contending that there is a huge gap between the children who start education and those who complete +2. He said that poverty, lack of opportunities were the major causes for the drop out. He dwelled on the schemes introduced for the inmates of Puzhal prison. He expressed concern on the fire accidents recalling the pathetic story at kumbakonam.

The toppers of SYMA Growth in + 2 " P Amudambigai (1055), Sathya Priya (1033) R Dilip Kumar (1016) and Vaidyanathan (1004) along with the toppers in X Standard KS Ahmed Siddika (461), S Priyanka (443) and K Raja Durai (434) were honoured and given prizes – an award instituted in the name of V Krishnan by Ms Bharathi Baskar.

The toppers of schools from Triplicane in the 10th and 12th standards were honoured with a medal and prize – an award in the name of Mrs Rajalakshmi Padmanabhan – instituted by TA Ramachandran.

This year we provided uniform to around 1200 students and a small group representing the students was distributed uniforms on stage. Rest of the selected recipients were given uniforms immediately after the closure of the function. This year we provided financial assistance amounting to Rs.2000/- to 25 students.

SYMA as a socially responsible organization has been respecting and appreciating other organizations and individuals rendering service to the society. To us, when it comes to serving the society, there cannot be any competition as each would be unique in their own way and contribute to the well being of the society. Established in 1984, Sankara Eye Hospital is an ISO certified non-profit charitable organization. The catch line reads "Miracles cannot cure the blind, together we can". The hospital provides high quality, cost effective eye care service to everyone. Their program titled 'Kannoli-Vision Saver' reaches out to rural poor. The hospital offers specialized treatment for all ophthalmic ailments and is recognised by most of the Insurers including 'Star Health' Remarkably, this hospital has so far performed close to 120000 cataract surgeries of which most are free. The hospital is housed in a three-storied building having 160 beds, three sophisticated operation theatres, served by highly trained and committed team of medical experts. There are special packages for paying patients.

They conduct camps at various locations and those below poverty line are selected for free surgery and taken to the hospital in their own vehicle. The friendly counselling on the steps to be followed in the post-operative period is a big boost.

The Hospital appears for generous support to create endowment from patrons on days of significance to the patrons. The interest accrued from donations will be utilized for free surgery to poor patients every year.

A: India Gate, designed by Edwin Lutyens is one of the largest war memorials. Originally it was All India War Memorial commemorating the soldiers of erstwhile British Indian Army who lost their lives WW I and Afghan wars. From 1971, it is Amar Jawan Jyoti (the flame of the immortal warrior) – the shrine is a black marble cenotaph with a rifle placed on its barrel, crested by a soldier's helmet. This was unveiled on 26th Jan 1972 by the then PM, Indira Gandhi in the wake of Indo Pak war of 1971. The now vacant canopy in front of India Gate earlier had the statue of King George V.

CELEBRATING MADRAS DAY

The founding day of Madras is considered to be August 22, 1639. It was on that day, in that year, that a sliver of land, where Fort. St. George stands today, was transacted by the East India Company. The deal was struck by Francis Day, his 'dubash' Beri Thimmappa, and their superior, Andrew Cogan, with the local Nayak rulers. It is believed that this deal was made on August 22, 1639. Out of the fort, grew settlements. Then the villages around it were brought together. And then, the old and new townes linked up. And then we had the city. Today, Chennai stands tall for a variety of reasons. Education, healthcare, IT, history, tourism, auto industries, movies, etc. And yes, it also has its warts. Madras Day celebrates the city.
