Wishing you a very happy Deepavali – the great festival which lifts the moods of children and elders alike. Shops are bustling with activity as people are busy buying clothes, sweets and gold. Elections to local bodies are scheduled on 17th & 19th of this month. These are extremely important for all of us as they concern the civic activities and we must exercise our franchise for the candidate who is most certain to attend to the needs of civic society. Keep in mind that garbage cleaning, environmental hygiene, keeping streets clean, provision of lights at roads and the like are the quintessence of local governance. By some queer logic the Planning Commission pegged poverty in Urban areas at Rs.32/- per capita per day; in rural areas it is Rs.26/-; this purportedly is the affidavit filed in a public interest litigation filed by the Right to Food Campaign. In economics, inflation is a rise in the general level of prices of goods and services in an economy over a period of time. The prices have been going up and the common man feels the pinch with every increase, felt more intensely in festive seasons. There is another factor known as Food inflation determined on the basis of wholesale price Index. At a time when Lokpal garnered the whole attention, the rulers and others should think of the proposed food bill also.

Another matter of grave concern is the ever rising cost of health care. India is amongst the leading producers of drugs, still a high % of population cannot afford buy essential drugs at the present cost itself. In India unlike other countries, a very high % of drugs are sold through retail shops. The no. of drugs whose prices were controlled by the Govt has decreased rapidly and only very little is spent on Public health. The movement of Anna Hazare backed effectively by the electronic media brought to the fore the need for bridling corruption in Govt. The crusaders and activists need to understand that corruption exists in other spheres also and should ensure to keep all the pertinent areas free of corrupt practices. The famed institution of Parliament's credibility has gone down because of the presence of some with criminal background and the way the proceedings are stalled. It rose in unison to state that the prerogative of law making is solely theirs; they also have a responsibility to ensure that strong systems are in place to keep things under their control. Surprisingly there was even a proposal for lifting the ban on sexdetermination tests so that parents are legally able to choose the gender of their child.

Petrol prices keep going up and for long crude oil price rise was stated to be the reason, but when the prices are plummeting down, there is not even a murmur of bringing them down. Cricket fans continued to rejoice as Mumbai Indians won the Champions League T20 – how the National team fares in the 5 one dayers at home against England is what remains to be seen. Deepavali the festival of lights is on 26th October 2011. For all of us it is one the most joyous moments. We celebrate Deepavali, by getting up early in the morning, having oil bath, wearing new clothes, bursting crackers, eating sweets, visiting our relatives and paying obeisance to elders and receiving their blessings.

All of us need to celebrate this festival safely and ensure that we do not cause inconvenience to others. The highlight of Deepavali are the multicoloured thrilling crackers and dazzling flower pots, sparklers, twinklers and more. The explosive pyrotechnic fireworks that light the air are extremely entertaining. Here are some basic precautions towards safety:-

- Purchase them only from authorized shops. Keep the crackers in a closed box, out of reach of children and animals.
- Keep them away from all the sources of heat.
- Wear Cotton Clothes: Don't wear loose clothes which can catch fire easily. Maintain distance between your body and crackers.
- Light crackers in open spaces; one at a time; don't light crackers holding them; don't keep crackers inside pocket or light them in a tin or bottle for extra sound effect; light crackers in open spaces.
- Never try to reignite partially burnt ones.
- Discard used ones in a bucket of water
- Keep Children Away: or ensure that they alight under the supervision of elders.;
- Always keep a bucket of water. In case of any injury, water can serve you better. In case of any burn or cut, splash tap water on the burn until the burning sensation reduces. Cover the area of the burn with a moist and sterile bandage. Don't use blanket or towel to cover the burn. Provide proper medication by qualified personnel as immediately as possible.
- Don't light them near animals. Take care to ensure that old aged persons are not near when you light them.

Deepavali is great fun and it is the time to celebrate. Taking little precautions will ensure that the fun remains throughout for every one around.

வாழ்க ஜனநாயகம்!

After many a changes the 'wear helmet' rule is back again. One can cite innumerable reasons of falling hear, sweat, smell, difficulty in carrying and more but remember your head is more precious than everything. The Administration does the rule no good by selectively enforcing it and penalizing once in a while. Typically, Chennai riders would like to try their luck in driving without getting caught stating it to be cumbersome and time consuming! A little care will sure save life

You might be a very safe driver – still accidents do occur and it is the speed at which one would hit the ground that matters. Helmets made of fibreglass and thermoplastic act like a shell for protecting the brain. The inside of a helmet is lined with expanded polystyrene (EPS) of controlled density. When the helmet is struck with a hard surface, the inner lining acts as a buffer and absorbs the shock. It bears the sudden change in energy and pressure and keeps the skull intact. The EPS may crush but it still protects the skull. When the skull is hit it moves towards the brain, leading to brain damage. The helmet, by buffering the impact of shock and dissipating the energy, prevents the skull from causing an impact on the brain. The ones who are helmeted would prevent possible critical head and facial injuries.

Ensure that you don't wear cheaper ones but trust only approved makes. Ensure that there is a nylon or tyrelene strap and that you strap them properly. It should not be too tight or wobbly. The Police eyes need not be watching – wear them for your good and for the benefit of those who love you.

Do you know the no. of districts in Tamilnadu? Can you name at least 20 of them?

Presently the State of Tamilnadu has 32 districts – the last to be carved out were Ariyalur and Tripur. District Collector is the head of the District Administration.

Districts are divided into Taluks for the purpose of Revenue Administration.

After the Nation's indepedencein 1947, Madras Presidency became Madras State, renamed as Tamil Nadu in 1968. In 1953, 11 northern districts of Madras State became the State of Andhra Pradesh. In 1956, the boundaries of the State were redrawn. At that time, Madras State had 13 districts. In 1966 Dharmapuri was born out of Salem. Similar carving out of new districts have been taking place somewhat regularly and some have further been redrawn. In 1996, the names of some districts were changed – thus Kamarajar became Virudhunagar, Pasumpon became Sivaganga, Periyar became Erode, Kattabomman became Tirunelveli, and Madras became Chennai.

In the wake of the present century, Ariyalur was split from Perambalur; again to merge in 2003 and again split in 2007. In 2008, Tiruppur was carved out of Coimbatore and Erode districts. Presently, we have these 32 administrative districts: -

Ariyalur; Chennai; Coimbatore; Cuddalore; Dharmapuri; Dindigul; Erode; Kancheepuram; Kanyakumari; Karur; Krishnagiri; Madurai; Nagapattinam; Namakkal; Perambalur; Pudukottai; Ramanathapuram; Salem; Sivaganga; Thanjavur; Nilgiris; Theni; Thiruvallur; Thiruvannamalai; Thiruvarur; Thiruvarur; Trichirappalli; Tuticorin; Vellore; Villupuram and Virudhunagar

Ans: It was more than 50 years ago in 1960. It was the 44th American Presidential election when Republican President D Eisenhower was not eligible and Richard Nixon was nominated. The Democrats nominated John F Kennedy, Senator from Massachusetts. It is believed that but for those televised debate, Kennedy would not have become the President. He won with a lead of 112,827 votes, or 0.1% of the popular vote, giving him a victory of 303 to 219 in the Electoral College. The televised dual fundamentally altered the way of political campaigns.
