- Now year after year we are distributing more than 1000 uniforms to school children.

A gist of our Activities during the year 2010 - 2011 : -

At the outset a big thanks to all our members for the total support in initiating and successfully implementing so many projects. SYMA is committed to the cause of serving people and we will continue to strive for the betterment of the society.

Medical Service:

 From 13th Mar 2009, we are running the medical centre and lab independently, and continue to be guided by Dr Sridhar.

This year we served 9459 Patients and 2595 benefitted at our Diagnostic lab.

We are thankful to the Doctors who have been rendering medical advice to the patients. We want to appreciate the services of Medical Faculty consisting of: Dr K Shivakumar, Dr Seetharaman, Dr V Poongothai, Dr Kalanidhi, Dr N Indumathy Dr Nagaiah Chetty, Dr Arunkumar & Dr Vidhya Venkatesh who have been a great source of strength.

Our cherished dream of a SYMA hospital catering to the poor providing quality medical care would dawn to a reality one day.

Medical Camps:

On 23rd May 2010, we conducted a Camp at Bharathiyar Illam on Kidney disease awareness.
 Kidney malfunctioning is a leading cause of death



Chronic kidney disease (CKD) is a progressive loss of renal function over a period of time. The costs and complications involved in treatment of kidney disease can be avoided by early detection.

To increase the awareness amongst common public, We organized this awareness camp which was sponsored by Wockhardt Laboratories. Dr S Jayalakshmi & Dr Indhumathi conducted the camp. Over 100 persons were screened and follow up action recommended. Dr.S. Jayalakshmi, MD DM (Nephro) presented a power point presentation and explained in detail about the kidney disorders and the need for identification at early stage. There was an interactive Q & A session also.


There was follow up action also. Dr S Jayalakshmi gave consultations to the patients twice after prescribing suitable medicines.

- ◆ Blood Camp: On 27th June 2010, we organized a Blood donation camp at Bharathiyar Illam in association with Kanchi Kamakoti Child Trust Hospital, Nungambakkam. Days prior to the camp, our young brigade led by Prasad went on a street to street campaign. There was an impressive turnout of more than 100 0f which 85 donated blood. Dr. Krishnamachari gave a thought provoking lecture on blood donation to our volunteers.
- On Independence Day, the Eye camp was inaugurated at Sri Sirvi Samaj Bhavan. This camp for detection of cataract was organized in association with Sri Sankara Eye Hospital Pammal, Lions Club of Chennai Venus, Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Sankara Medical Trust and Sirvi Samaj.

The Chief Guest was Mr Mohan Ram, a famous cine artist. Mr J.Babu, CEO of Pammal Sankara detailed about the troubles that could all vision and explained the various activities of Pammal Sankara Hospital and their reach to rural poor. More than 250 persons had registered in the camp. Around 200 were screened.

24 persons were detected with eye problems requiring surgical treatment for cataract. They were provided meals and were taken to Pammal Sankara Eye Hospital, Pammal. Free cataract surgery was performed on 16th August. A group of our Office bearers visited them and enquired their well being. Those underwent operation were brought back and dropped at Triplicane. Thebeneficiaries were very happy and blessed SYMA for our active social service and wished the well being of all of us.

- On 25/8/10, spectacles were distributed to 25 persons at our medical centre in memory of our beloved member late Mr K. E Raghavan.
- Our Indian culture respects elderly persons and traditionally we are given to paying obeisance to elderly people. Getting older is a demographic evolution. Preventive checkups from time to time are necessary. On 24th Oct 10, we conducted 'Free Health check up camp' for elderly people. This was organized jointly by us with Lions Club of South Madras and in association with Novartis. In the camp at Bharathiyar Illam, more than 100 persons were screened and underwent tests for checking blood pressure, blood sugar, Eye checkup and ECG. Some were prescribed glasses, which were available at a very nominal cost. Apart from these, the aged persons were also screened for Dementia.



On 28th Nov 2010, we organized a health camp at Bharathiar Illam in coordination with VS Hospital, Chetput. Dr Subramaniam, a leading Oncologist—spoke to a gathering on the symptoms, research and treatment besides offering tips for leading a healthy disease free life. Around 75 persons underwent screening by Gynecologist; around 100 were screened and were provided free consultation by Ortho and Dental specialists.

Education:

The Uniform distribution function took place on 4th July 2010 at Bharathiyar Illam. The distinguished Chief Guests were Mr TT Srinivasa Raghavan, MD Sundaram Finance and Sri AVM Saravanan, Film Producer.

More than 1200 sets of uniforms were distributed to school children after a due screening process ensuring that the beneficiaries were from the lower strata of the society.

Last year, students of our SYMA Growth did exceedingly well and keeping up of our promise, we provided Rs. 10000/- each to six students who secured more than 1000 marks [out of 1200] and got admitted to Engineering colleges. For 17 students who secured more than 400 in 10th standard, we provided financial assistance of Rs.2000/- each.

All the school toppers of Triplicane schools were also honoured on the occasion.

SYMA Sewa Award, an award recognizing the good work of individuals to the Society was conferred on Mrs Pankajam Sridhar.

SYMA Growth - our Tuition Centre

This year we had planned to expand our tuition centre in a big way. Applications were distributed and screening of students was done. Students in large numbers requested support on various subjects. In the month of July 2010, We conducted a meeting with the parents as also a separate meeting with the teachers and the third year of SYMA Growth was launched. The initial response was overwhelming and at times too unwieldy to manage.

After many years of successful conduct of Child Fest for which we have seen milling crowds, this year was a different experience as we moved to newer venue and planned a split show.

On 30/1/2011 was the Drawing Competition held at the prestigious Hindu Higher Secondary School. Child Fest started with our feeling the need to create a congenial atmosphere promoting competitive spirit and to enthuse the school children to participate in extra curricular activities.

On 30th Jan, despite being a new venue, children flocked to Hindu Higher Sec School, Triplicane. With the experience gained in the past, the competition was in 6 groups for students ranging from LKG to 12th standard held at four different time – staggered to ensure that there were no two activities at any given time which helped us in crowd management. A total list of 1500 participants would please any Organisation though this is low by SYMA's tall standards.

The Programme was inaugurated in the morning by Mr Thirumalai, Head Master of Hindu High School Volunteers of Soundarya Rathinamala Isai Kuzhu, a group of others who were brought by Mrs Uthra Sarang, SYMA volunteers and others ensured that everything was according to the plans drawn up earlier.

All the participating children were given prize and a Certificate commending their participation. Nestle India sponsored pasta to all at the venue and distributed crayons to all participating children.

In the end, the children and parents left with happiness writ large in their faces.




