Medical Service:

From 13th Mar 2009, we are running the medical centre and lab independently, and continue to be guided by Dr Sridhar.

This year we served 6433 Patients at our Medical Centre and 2700 benefitted at our Diagnostic lab.

We appointed permanent doctor to our medical centre and our special thanks to Dr. NagaiahChetty for his continuous support.

On the successful completion of the Silver Jubilee year of our Medical Centre, we thank all the doctors, volunteers, Sri Kanchi Kama KotiSankara Medical Trust and the office bearers who worked along with us to make this happen.

In the event of Silver Jubilee celebration a souvenir was released. A special thanks to

Mr. TA Sathyanarayanan and Mr. R Kannan who worked hard to bring it a grand success.

We are thankful to the Doctors who have been rendering medical advice to the patients. We want to appreciate the services of Medical Faculty consisting of Dr.NagaiahChetty, Dr. Vidhya, Dr. Arul Kumaran, Dr. Poongothai who has been a great source of strength.

Our cherished dream of a SYMA hospital catering to the poor providing quality medical care would dawn to a reality one day.

Medical Camps:

On the great day of our National Independence, SYMA continues to dedicate itself to the service of the Nation, remember the patriotic deeds and sacrifices of so many, because of whom we are breathing free air. At 8.30 am, the National flag was hoisted by Dr Ashok Rangarajan, Director, Sankara Eye Hospital, Pammal.After this, we proceeded to Triplicane • Permanent Fund. Over the past decade and half and more, we have been conducting Eye Camp on Nation's Independence Day. Every year, it has been happening at Sri Seervi Samaj Bhavan, whose management have been associating with us for the event.

This year due to construction activities, the venue was not available and Triplicane PermanentFund readily pitched in.At 9.00am the Eye Camp was inaugurated at FundKalyanaMantap at Singarachari Street. This camp for detection of cataract was organized in association with Pammal Sri Sankara EyeHospital, Lions Club of ChennaiVeenus, Sri KanchikamakotiSankaraMedical Trust and Triplicane Permanent Fund.

It is our fortune to be associated with a great hospital committed to serving poor, stretching out to small villages and helping more than 2 lakh people providing vision. Miracles cannot cure blind buttogether we can.... is their catchline. It is heartening to know that they have recently expanded in a big way at far off Samarjhola, Odishawith a multibedded hospital that has facilities for comprehensive eye Care, investigations and outpatient treatment, low vision clinic, contact lens clinic, special clinic for children, micro phaco cataract surgeries for spectacle free vision, and glaucoma services. We are ever thankful to the Doctors, Medical and other staff of Sankara Eye Hospital and special thanks are due to Mr J Babu. More than 250 persons had registered in the camp. Around 190 were screened. More than 20 were found requiring cataract surgery. 15 persons were taken to the hospital at Pammal and underwentcataract surgery. 25 persons were prescribed spectacles — and were given free — in memory of our beloved KE Raghavan, who was snatched away from our midst few years ago. We place on record our appreciation to Mr MA Sadagopan for the coordination and arrangement of the Eye Camp.

A group of our Office bearers visited them and enquired their well being. Those underwent operation were brought back and dropped at Triplicane a day after surgery. The beneficiaries were very happy and blessed SYMA for our active social service and wished the well being of all of us. We at SYMA continue to strive for the betterment of society and provide helping hand to the poor and needy.

Educational aid

SYMA is wedded to the cause of social service — Educational Assistance has been our preferred field for long. Every children has the right to be educated. Only education will uplift them to higher echelons. Even in this rich metropolis, sadly there are many children who could ill-afford to have proper uniforms. We strongly believe that we can make some difference to the way these unfortunate children attend their school. For over two decades now, we have been providing new uniforms to poor students. This year also we distributed applications, scrutinized and finalized at one stroke, the recipients based on economic criteria. The students came to the venue, had their applications completed and walked out with cards with which they collected the uniforms without



hassle. Every year in our Function, we distribute uniforms, honour the school toppers of various schools in Triplicane, extend financial assistance to some students and honour a good social worker with 'SYMA Sewa Award'. That in essence is our Educational Aid programme. 11th July 2015 was the day and we held our Educational Aid Programme at 5 pm at NKT National Girls High School, Triplicane. Our Secretary, S Sampathkumar compered the programme, welcomed the Guests and introduced those on stage. President TA Sampathkumar in his Presidential address spoke about our various activities, tracing the origin, and dwelt at length on our vision and ideals. Every year we have eminent people who have excelled in life — ensuring that students feel encouraged by great role-models.

This year the Chief Guest was Shri NK Ranganath, MD of Grundfos Pumps India P Ltd, from its inception in 1988. An annual production of more than 16 million pumps makes Grundfos one of the World's leading pump manufacturers. The other guest was Shri R. Vijayaraghavan, well known to Triplicanites through his philanthropy. Not many of us know of his rich experience of 4 decades in health, critical care and hospital management. He had introduced new drugs in India and specialised in nephrology care. Over the years, he has established several dialysis centres all over the country and in Nepal offering quality care to thousands of kidneyfailure patients with 300000 hemodialysis over 15 years. He has helped social organisations like Lions club to establish and run Hemodialysis at low costs. He is involved in promoting a retirement home titled 'Sri AnandhaNilayam' at Kanchi. He is also the Founder Trustee of Akshaya Athreya Trust which focusses on education, health and promotion of our heritage, Vedas and scriptures. Our tuition centre SYMA Growth has been providing systematic support throughout the academic year to select students and our students have excelled this year too. We are fortunate to have dedicated teachers striving to provide quality education.

This year the SYMA Seva award was conferred on Mrs KN Vijayalakshmi, who has been providing quality tuition at our Centre. Relief work

Much water has flown under the bridge' is an oft repeated cliché meaning that something is in the past and no longer important. It was water of different kind for Chennaites. Around Deepavali 2015, there were rains dampening the spirits. Dec 2015 started differently. At Chennai much water flowed under the bridge, no - actually flowed over the bridges at Saidapet and Adyar. The incessant rains, floods breaching the tanks inundated many residential areas, bringing untold hardships to Chennaites, and people of Tamil Nadu rose up in spectacular fashion, helping each other. Triplicane, the abode of Lord Parthasarathi remained absolutely unaffected - Thiruvallikkenivasis, Organisationsand more were in the forefront doing rescue work. SYMA proudly organised providing help to the people. For 5 continuous days from 2nd Dec, SYMA volunteers in trucks fanned out to various rain-affected localities distributing biscuits, food, milk, dress material, mats, blankets

Dec 4 2015

Triplicane, fortunately is not affected badly. Today Thiruvallikkeni buzzed with activity. Srinivas Youngmens Association [SYMA] organised relief work. We organised sets of raincoats for Corporation workers [must place on record the great work they are doing in many parts of the city]. We arranged a mini-truck, carried relief material including mats, new blankets, new sarees. rice bags and food packets. We planned to handover the materials to Seva Barathi at Tambaram and travelled via Poonamallee High Road, Maduravoyal bridge.

There was water, water and more ... On way saw river in spates and water flowing on roads in some places. Could not move beyond Thiruneermalai and were forced to return back distributing food on the way. At Anakaputhur, it was a pathetic sight - people at housetops water running like a small river - marooned, we could not move them out - but provided them food, blanket, mats - passing them through rope. We finally distributed the relief material at Maduravoyil Govt High School and returned home.

Dec 5-2015

Today too, dawned with lot of hope - in fact when we embarked our relief work, most of us were not wearing raincoats. This day our experience was different - food packets were coming from many sources - and there was a special team of enthusiastic women packing the hot food in foils. The relief material of food, blankets, clothes, biscuits, water packets was loaded in a truck ~ and Vittal Nana had arranged yes, boats - 2 them on a truck stood before Sri Parthasarathi temple. ... and another mini van too followed. So many volunteers - all set for relief work.

As we wound through Beach road, Adyar bridge, Raj bhavan, 100 ft road – reaching Velachery junction – it was all smooth – road at this point was blocked as there was some water logging near the Madipakkam bridge above Velachery MRTS – the relief vehicles were allowed by Police to proceed. As we were over the bridge, there was a sharp spell of rains. We passed through 'kaiveli' – selected Ram Nagar near Sri Oppiliappan temple – the boat was lowered into water – it was knee deep and slightly more at places – many pockets were loaded on the boat [a group of us were joined by RSS workers who had come from elsewhere] – we went through many lanes – the ground floor flats had been affected and people had left the place – there were some staying in 1st floor – and there were many construction workers too, stranded. We distributed food, biscuits and water to them.

I am generally no great admirer of pet dogs – here a man suggested that some dogs inside an under-construction building had been starving for the past few days – we had only rice in hand – and that was devoured by them.

Another group of SYMA volunteers with another boat went to another area, few lanes away – they too had a similar experience. The van with other materials went and distributed them in the area under the Velachery bridge – which was badly inundated with sewer water running. We too joined them there. There was slight commotion as the materials were not enough.

On the way we saw, army jawans distributing food, some parisals, some boats and NDRF with dinghies. Many people are doing relief work – there were to be at least 3 sharp showers for brief durations, which was a great dampener as we apprehend that it might put back the position. We found none to be rescued, but the boats helped to carry large amount of food packet and other material much inside.

Praying for speedy restoration and people getting back to normalcy – the city has had more than enough!

6th Dec ember 2015

People may be tired of rains – SYMA continued its relief work for the 4th day in succession. Today too we had 2 boats, 2 trucks + a car and more – carrying food packets, dress materials, biscuits, bread and today thoughtfully milk packets for children [and some sanitary napkins too]

Today's destination was Semmencherry – we did not go to the usual nagars but with material loaded on the boat to the vast expanse of construction in knee deep flowing water and inside there are more than 150 people – construction workers with many children. There we distributed food, dress, milk and others.

Then we moved on to Kannagi Nagar nearer Thuraipakkam – inside we were told by an active worker belonging to ruling party that there are around 2300 people and many of the areas were badly affected as Buckingham canal and the other waterbody from Thuraipakkam intersect

this place and water gushed from the river. When you have thousands of people, and you have few hundreds of blankets and the like – things could turn chaotic to violent. We deposited them with the local councillor in a hospital building to be aggregated and distributed by them.

Another group went to Kotturpuram area; while some more were distributed nearer Adyar Malar hospital. SYMA is pondering on slowing down the relief and do some meaningful strategic support in rehabilitation

Flood rehabilitation ~ SYMA at Kottur High School 2016

Dec 2015 would remain etched in the memory of Chennaiites ~ for the devastation that followed incessant rains. I have earlier posted about the relief works that SYMA did at various places.

After the initial days, we regrouped to strategically do some rehabilitation and we are committed to reaching out the needy utilising all those donations made to us by philanthropists. Like many other places, Kottur was once a village – TNSC in its wisdom constructed flats in the river bed, since it was the dead-end at that time. Puram means exterior in Tamil and hence Kotturpuram. This area was worst affected in 1977 and now too! In the recent rains, Kottur too was badly affected. Through Mr SR Ragunathan, Chief Photo editor, The Hindu, we came to know the tribulations of the school students. we came in contact with the Mrs Kalpana, HM of Chennai High School, at New Street, Kottur. The teachers here guided by HM displayed great care and concern for the students of this school. We organised through EMRI [special thanks to Mr B Prabhudoss] counselling for the affected students and provided some relief.

GVK EMRI (Emergency Management and Research Institute) is one good thing that happened in 2005. 108 is synonymous with emergency support saving many lives. Recently, they have introduced novel 2-wheeler ambulance services also. Besides, GVK EMRI with TN Govt is operating integrated "104 Health Advice Helpline Services" For those who underwent suffering during floods, especially young students — the stress of the trauma is unbearable. With our active coordination, EMRI 104 Health Helpline conducted psychological counselling for children assisting them to overcome stress induced by floods. Psychologist MrElaya Raja and Mr B Prabudoss held a session at the school and organised activities and games that touched upon the symptoms of trauma and stress while speaking to students on how to effectively overcome them. Simple breathing techniques and exercises were taught. The concern and care exhibited and the efforts of the Head Mistress of the School and other Teachers in identifying and taking care of those students affected is commendable.

The HM & teachers had identified 83 students as affected – coordinating with them, we arranged to take dress measurements and organised one set of uniform and one colour dress for all of them. The school management also sought some additional support for 30 families [of their students] badly affected. We went to the School – handed over the stitched dress material as



also family kits that consisted of : kerosene stove; some utensils including tumblers, spoons; 3 kgs of rice; 1 ltr of Goldwinner refined oil(Thans to Mr.C.R.Sridhar); tur dhall; tamarind; red mirchi; tooth paste; soap and cleaning detergents. Around 20 students only were present today - though we had planned only to handover the material to the school, the HM and her staff organised a small meeting. We were delighted to hear the confident words of students who despite their hardships were focussed to studying well and progressing in the future.

The delight on the face of students on seeing the coloured dress - is worth the efforts that volunteers of SYMA have been taking these days. The rains and devastation certainly were unhappy ones – we as responsible citizens are doing out mire in making the Society a better place - and We feel happy that year 2016 has started in the right earnest for us.

Jan 3 2016 Rehabilittion Work

Our team from SYMA [Srinivas Youngmens Association] descended here -- in the past fortnight our VP, Mr SR Parthasarathi has made many sorties, assessed the situation and identified the affected people with the help of local Welfare association. After our dispensation at Chennai High School, Kottur, it was a different experience at Urapakkam, where people narrated their tale of woes - water entry, loss of property, entry of snakes and other creatures in to houses and more melancholy.

SYMA team with special mention of R.Seshadri @ Durai, SRP,TJR, Sudarshan and others worked overtime, preparing special relief kits that consisted of 5 kgs of rice; 1 kg of 3 dhall; 1 Itr of Goldwinner oil, many utensils including timber, tamarind, sugar, soap & detergents; dhoties and sarees [costing around Rs.1850 each] ~ today morning we distributed these kits to more than 200 families who queued up and received them without melee. The distribution took place at Senthamizh Salai 2nd Street, Selvaraj Nagar, Urapakkam.

Around 80 school bags too were distributed. SYMA on this occasion, thanks all its donors, well-wishers and volunteers.

This time, it was slightly different thought process. Instead of we going to affected places ~ [there is great difficulty in identifying those affected and more when it comes to distributing as sometimes, many others too vie] and it becomes difficult regulating and distributing. An association 'Tamilnadu Maruthuvar Samuthaya Peravai' [organisation for the hair stylists at various parts of the city) had identified their people at various places affected and through them SYMA issued tokens. Today, at 7, Singarachari Street, (Thanks to Mr.K.V.Ramesh for providing place to store all materials throughout Rehabilitation work) we distributed more than 120 family kits comprising of - kerosene pump stove, 5 kgs of rice; 1 kg of 3 dhall; 1 ltr of Goldwinner oil, many utensils including timber, tamarind, sugar, soap & detergents; dhoties and sarees [costing around Rs.2350 each]

The distribution was complete in 1 ½ hours in an orderly manner. SYMA on this occasion, thanks all its donors, well-wishers and volunteers.



Another set of 147 family kits distributed to residents of Kannamapet on 16.1.2016 at Triplcane itself.

CSI Higher Secondary School for the deaf, SYMA helped the school which was worst affected during floods with their groceries stock getting spoiled entirely. Syma was quick enough to lend a helping hand supplying them with groceries for 2 months

We thank Mr. Balakrishnan Perumbala from USA who have contributed Rs. 204266/ and through his friends Namitha Magoon Rs.66386/- & Mr. Sanjay Magoon — Rs.66386/-. We thank Mr. Biju Dhamodharan& Friends from muscat for his contribution of Rs. 100000/ towards flood relief and rehabilitation work.

Medical Centre: -

SYMA medical centre is our address. We take every care to ensure that patients who utilise our services are attended to properly and get the best medical attention. The lab charges very low cost for tests and at times, many apprehend whether they can get quality tests done at such low costs. In Jan 2016, we bought a new analyser costing around 1.50 lakhs for our lab, which automates most of the functions and is sophisticated. We have also bought computerised ECG at approx Rs. 50000. With this, we continue to serve the society providing quality medical support.

At the facade of the Centre, we have now an electronic scroll – customized and made for us by M/s Triad. We thank our member Mr S Parthasarathy for this. Besides details of charges at our lab, we are able to run details of SYMA's activities and info. that would benefit the common public. We scrolled info on road safety and need for wearing helmets.

Sri Parthasarathy Koil Post office

Some things have changed in life. Some have lost their sheen for no fault of theirs. There was this old building at VeeraraghavaMudali St [Big Street, Triplicane] that once stood majestically and bustled with activity and was brought down in Jan 2011. It was the most sought after one of yesteryears – 'the post office'. This one was officially known as "Parthasarathy Koil S.O" – a bigger one has been in existence at Triplicane High Road for long. The modern day youngsters might not know the cost of a Post card; may not even know that such thing exists! For none of the younger generation are in the habit of writing letter by hand to parents / spouse / brother and sister / loved ones / friend / teacher or somebody else? In fact many are not even in the habit of sending / responding personally to e-mails in the age of FB but have lots of time for sending forwards Do you know that besides the Communication Address viz., Postal address that consists of Door No., Street Name, Area, Citythere existed something known as PO Bag No.? History reveals that it was way back in 1712, Governor Harrison first started a Company Postal Service in Madras to carry mail to Bengal by dak runner. By 1736, a postal system of sorts was in place with a somewhat greater vision.

In 1774, a system of charging postage on private letters began. Decades later the postal rules were in place ~ Chennai General Post Office was initially opened in Fort St. George Square, just outside the Sea Gate, on 1 June 1786. Once that Big Street building was demolished - Sri Parthasarathy Koil PO suffered. It functioned for some time from the premises of Triplicane PO - for some time it was in the near dilapidated structure at Hanumantharayan Street - for many years residents of Thiruvallikkeni had been waiting patiently, moving mountains in the fond hope that seemingly endless wait of Sri Parthasarathi Koil PO at Thiruvallikkeni would dawn into a reality !!! ~ not all nursed the hope! It was of sentimental importance too. Any search on Sulekha pages or elsewhere would reveal the names of Post Offices as [certainly not the exhaustive list]: Adambakkam PO; Adyar PO; Alandur PO; Alwarthirunagar PO; and the like. There could be hundreds of post offices but to those residents of Triplicane - the building that housed Thiruvallikkeni ThapalNilayam is a monument and many would have green stories kindling nostalgia - and its name is unique for it is 'Sri Parthasarathi Koil Post Office' only one of its genre named not after the locality but after our presiding deity Sri Parthasarathi. 16th Dec 2015 dawned differently as with the concerted efforts of citizens of Thiruvallikkeni, Sri Parthasarathy Koil PO was reopened at North Tank Square Street, in a premises belonging to the Temple.
